

## VINCENT'S WALK DOWN MEMORY LANE

Vincent was born in 1920 and grew up on a dairy farm near the Coomera River with his parents, three brothers and two sisters. His family sold dairy products and grew monstrous pumpkins and watermelons. When he was old enough he helped his family on the farm and enjoyed spending time riding his palomino horse. During his time on the farm the Gold Coast encountered the 1931 flood. Vincent recalls fences were completely underwater and the cows had to hold their heads out of the water. It was a difficult time for everyone.

In his younger years Vincent attended Coomera State School where he found he had an extraordinary talent for math. Nothing was too hard for Vincent and he found that even the most difficult math, such as algebra, was easy for him and his talent did not go unnoticed. "My math teachers always had given me a hard time, accusing me of cheating on math tests because they had never seen me work out my answers on paper. I can work out any math equation in my head, sometimes faster than a calculator."

A young lady who was working on the dairy farm during WWII caught Vincent's attention. "We married on 2 February in 1946, and had five children who are still helping on the farm to this day. Having my children would be one of the most memorable moments of my life. "I have 23 grandchildren and 1 great grandchild. My grandchildren are also very talented with mathematics."

Vincent and his family moved to Southport in 1955 where he started his own building company with a mate. "We were known for being extremely fast and efficient. I built many houses all over the Gold Coast including the Binna Burra Lodge. I moved back to Coomera in 1981, and stayed there until 1998 breeding cattle dogs for show and I sold the puppies to every state in Australia and overseas."

At 100 years of age Vincent now resides in a quiet place on the Gold Coast. When asked what his secret is to living a long life he said, "I keep opening my eyes each morning." His prediction is he will live to at least 108 years old.

## Supporting all **Levels of Need**

#### Commonwealth Home Support Program ~ CHSP

CHSP is government subsidised funding to enable service providers to provide basic support and care. To be eligible you must be aged 65+, or 50+ for Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander peoples, and have a referral from My Aged Care. A minimal client contribution is required. We aim to support people to reach their goals ~ living a life of their choice.

#### **Home Care Packages ~ HCP**

Home care packages are for people aged 65+, or 50+ for Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander peoples. with more complex needs that go beyond what CHSP can provide. Costs are covered within your package.

A home care package offers a coordinated approach, with your care designed specific to your identified needs and goals.

## WHAT WE CAN DO FOR YOU

We offer services in your home, in our centre and/or in the community. Depending on the source of funding these services may include either one or a combination of:

- Domestic Assistance ~ house cleaning
- Social Support ~ assistance with shopping and banking, one on one outings ~ e.g. library, picnic, participating in a hobby
- Personal Care ~ hugiene assistance/personal grooming
- In Home Respite ~ allowing carers a well-deserved break
- Home Maintenance ~ lawn and garden maintenance
- Nursing
- Medical Aids and Equipment, and/or Home Modifications





We offer a variety of programs for participants funded by the NDIS. If you enjoy the outdoors and visiting various locations around the beautiful Gold Coast get on board with our Community Access group. ## Nerang Neighbourhood Centre Food Service

#### "We are here to help"

Nerang Neighborhood Centre Service is a not for profit community organisation which has been supporting people in the community for 13 years by ensuring that people receive affordable boxes filled with non-perishable food products. The Food Service is coordinated by Lisa Souwer along with the help of eight volunteers, and has been very fortunate to be able to fundraise through sausage sizzles at Nerang Bunnings on a weekly basis for many years. This supplemented fundraising is with donations of non-perishable food items and some amazing community support, including additional funding received due to COVID-19.



Food boxes are available to the public every Thursday from 1:30-4:00 pm and every Friday from 8:00-11:00 am at a cost of \$20. Fresh fruit and vegetables, donated by Fresh Express, are also available for an extra \$10-\$15. Food boxes must be ordered a week in advance and collected at 29 Martin Street, Nerang (opposite Liberty Community Connect).
